The JazzArts Academy had over 400 students registered for education programs!

eBop is an early childhood education program for preschool students and their parents/caregivers. Participants were guided through Jazz at Lincoln Center's awardwinning curriculum which emphasizes children's natural ability to improvise, as students explore their creativity through fun, interactive classes. Over the course of this interactive eight-week term. parents and caregivers, along with their children, explored the core concepts of jazz including swing, the blues, improvisation, and other jazz fundamentals. Together, they developed their imagination, creativity, and musicality while swinging to nursery rhymes, singing the blues away, scatting like Ella, improvising like Coltrane, and of course jamming with a live jazz band!





JAZZ IN SCHOOLS

azz in Schools is an education and community engagement program designed to reach students from kindergarten through high school. JazzArts provides age-appropriate assembly programs which are tailored for elementary, middle, or high school students with no music background required. These exciting and informative performance presentations include audience participation and a question-and-answer session for students and teachers!

Through a partnership with Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools E3 Program, "Jazz: The American Journey" was presented at five (5) CMS schools, reaching over 700 students.



NUESTRO TIEMPO LATIN JAZZ YOUTH ENSEMBLE

ntering its second year, Nuestro Tiempo Latin Jazz Youth Ensemble continues to build awareness and momentum within the Latino community of Charlotte. This program would not be possible without the support of Arts and Science Council and Albemarle Foundation empowering this program to remain free of charge for students. Forty-one students participated in Nuestro Tiempo Latin Jazz Youth Ensemble this year!

Nuestro Tiempo Latin Jazz Youth Ensemble students play classic Latin Jazz orchestra repertoire and learn fundamentals such as clave rhythms, improvisational theory, and Latin jazz history. This year, we welcomed our new director and arranger, iliana Rose. Born in Miami and raised by Cuban parents and grandparents she is steeped in Cuban rhythms and culture. After years of classical and jazz training, she graduated from the prestigious





University of Miami as well as the National Piano Guild with performance degrees. She moved to Los Angeles and formed her band, "The iliana Rose Cuban Jazz Band" and worked with some of the finest musicians in the industry.

You may have seen her leading the ensemble at the JazzArts Academy Fall Concert, where students brought in the holiday spirit with a swinging and festive performance. Joining the performance were dancers from Rumbao Latin Dance Company which elevated the music and left audience members dancing in their seats.





JAZZARTS YOUTH ENSEMBLES + WORKSHOPS

azzArts Youth Ensembles + Workshops is an applied program offered to students who want to continue improving their individual skills within the context of a small jazz ensemble. 107 individual student experiences in Youth Ensembles + Workshops this year! Students have had the opportunity to perform publicly on numerous occasions, including a community performance at Aldersgate Senior Living Community to bring live jazz to its residents. These opportunities build confidence, provide creative expression, and give students a chance to interact with the community.

One highlight from the year was the JazzArts All-Star Youth Ensemble's visit to the Jazz Education Network (JEN) Conference in New Orleans after being selected to perform at the prestigious international conference. In addition to being honored as featured conference performers, the group was able to tour New Orleans and learn about the history of the city and its jazz origins from JazzArts Charlotte President and CEO (and JEN Board President), Lonnie Davis. Some of the experiences included visiting Congo Square, New Orleans Jazz Museum, VueOrleans, and a historical bus tour. After a day and a half of sight-seeing, the group immersed themselves in jazz performances, presentations, and lectures for four straight days at the JEN Conference. We are so proud of our students who were selected to perform, and it was a life changing experience for all involved!

JAZZARTS SUMMER MUSIC CAMP

azzArts Summer Music Camp is a week-long immersive program where students learn jazz history, improvisation, and performance all while gaining self-confidence and creativity. This summer 63 students participated in our summer music camp!

Each day, our students were guided by some of the best jazz performers and educators in the region. Additionally, they were joined by Charlotte-native, trumpeter Ashlin Parker, and special guest camp clinician, saxophonist Marcus Strickland. When asking students what their favorite part of camp was, we heard "jam sessions," "theory classes," "learning from the guest instructor." However, the ultimate favorite was meeting like-minded peers and building friendships. One parent shared, "even within two days of finishing camp, our son has been invited to meet up with and play with (new) friends he made."

Experiences like Summer Music Camp shape a student for a lifetime. To close out the week, students performed in a final concert open to the public, where many students performed jazz for the very first time! We are grateful to our sponsors, donors, and UNC Charlotte for helping to make our summer music camp a huge success.





NEW MERIT-BASED SCHOLARSHIP AWARD

azzArts was proud to introduce a merit-based scholarship opportunity for JazzArts Academy students, in addition to current financial support scholarships. Winners received a scholarship that will cover fall and spring semester of Youth Ensembles + Workshops and Summer Music Camp for the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year.

Many students applied through an initial video audition submission, and the judges identified six student finalists. These students led a professional ensemble in the live final round performance, free and open to the public, with immediate feedback and critique from the adjudicators. Each student shined brightly as they showcased their talents. In the end, three students emerged to

receive the year-long scholarship opportunity.

Congratulations to all our finalist and to our scholarship winners Yusuf, Jameson, and Luke. It was a privilege for JazzArts to be able to offer this opportunity to our young, dedicated musicians. Scholarships like this are only

possible because of the generous investments our donors make in support of our students.










REVENUE AND EXPENSES


